Forman Arts Initiative (FAI), Forman Arts Initiative (FAI) is dedicated to supporting community-based arts and creativity in Philadelphia through programming, convening, and advocacy. FAI serves as a platform to connect, mentor, and support artists and organizations around Philadelphia to deepen and to grow the rich cultural heritage of Philadelphia's communities.

Led by Pedro Ramos, the **Philadelphia Foundation** (PF) was established in 1918 as a charitable trust to administer community-based philanthropy. Over the following 100-plus years, PF has served as a trusted partner connecting people who care with causes that matter.

## Eligibility Requirements - Organizations

- Organizations must be a 501(c)(3) nonprofit.
- They must operate in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery or Philadelphia counties in Pennsylvania or Burlington or Camden counties in New Jersey.
- Organizations without 501(c)(3) public charity status must operate in Greater Philadelphia and have a fiscal sponsor, which can be located anywhere in the U.S.
- Organizations with budgets between \$250,000 and \$5 million are eligible to apply.
- Applicants must demonstrate their deep connection to and track record of working with BIPOC (Black, Indigenous and People of Color Communities) and historically underserved communities
- They must have an established commitment to incorporating community perspectives into their work.
- They must have a board-approved policy affirming that they do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, disability, or any other legally protected characteristics.

## Eligibility Requirements - Artists

- Must be individual artists who operate in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery or Philadelphia counties in Pennsylvania or Burlington or Camden counties in New Jersey.
- Applicants must demonstrate their deep connection to and track record of working with BIPOC (Black, Indigenous and People of Color Communities) and historically underserved communities.

## Eligibility Requirements - Collectives

- Artist Collectives must be a group of three people or more, working collaboratively around a common mission without a 501(c)(3) status. Collectives must operate in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery or Philadelphia counties in Pennsylvania or Burlington or Camden counties in New Jersey.
- Applicants must demonstrate their deep connection to and track record of working with BIPOC (Black, Indigenous and People of Color Communities) and historically underserved communities.

## Guidelines – Organizations

- Four community-based organizations will be selected to receive two-year, unrestricted grants.
- Awards will range from \$75,000-\$150,000 (total) over two years and can be used to support any aspect of an organization's mission.
- Organizations will be chosen based on how closely their work aligns with *Art Works*' programmatic goals.
- Organizations may host a Drexel Co-op student as an additional resource.

### **Drexel Co-op Resource**

Grantee organizations will be offered an additional opportunity to host cooperative education students from Drexel University to enhance organizational effectiveness. Organizations that choose this option will work with one co-op student at a time during their grant cycle.

- Drexel's Co-op program balances classroom theory with periods of practical, hands-on experience prior to graduation from Drexel University.
- Students combine academic study with FT job and gain experience in their field
- The co-ops run for six months and are full-time positions in areas where organizations need extra staffing

The Forman Arts Initiative will support up to 25 co-op positions for grantees over the duration of the grant program.

 The co-op hiring process and grant management will be handled by the Lenfest Center for Cultural Partnerships at Drexel University with the assistance of the Steinbright Career and Development Center.

### Guidelines –Artists

- Four Philadelphia-based artists will be selected to receive two-year grants of \$50,000 (total) for two years
- Grants are unrestricted; they can be used freely by artists
- Grants are taxable
- Some artists may wish to use the grant to support the development of new work, while others may use it to pay for living or studio expenses.
- Artists will be chosen based on how closely their work aligns with *Art Works'* programmatic goals

### Guidelines – Collectives

- We are looking to support collectives who have an established track record of working in partnership with Black, Indigenous and people of color (BIPOC) and historically under-resourced communities.
- Collectives will receive between \$50,000 and \$150,000 (total) for two years depending on the scope of their work and their engagement with the community.
- We define collectives as three or more people working collaboratively under a common mission or goal without a 501(C)(3) status.
- Collectives will need to provide a fiscal sponsor upon receiving the grant and will be responsible for any administrative fees charged by the sponsor to the host collective.




